ESOTERIC

- **Def** → designed for or understood by the specially initiated alone; requiring or exhibiting knowledge that is restricted to a small group
- **P.O.S.** → **ADJECTIVE**
- **Clue** → **Ask the cleric!**
- If you require further esoteric information about the Church of the Flying Spaghetti Monster, ask the cleric!

You've missed him.



EUPHEMISM

- Def → A gentle way of rephrasing something
- P.O.S. → NOUN
- Clue → You've missed him!
- The mother claimed, "You've missed him!" She explained that the dog went to sleep with the angels, which is a euphemism.
