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Major Units of Study

Students will study various works of literature, vocabulary, grammar, writing, and be given STAAR/EOC preparation. This course will cover the Language Arts Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) and explore the culture, beliefs and influences of literature and writing from around the world. This course is designed to prepare students for Advanced Placement English III and Advanced Placement English IV in their 11th and 12th grade years at James Bowie High School.

Textbooks are now available online. Hard copies of the literature textbook will remain in my classroom. Most of the novels that we will read in class will be provided. Students have the option of purchasing their own copies at the Bowie Book Fair during Back to School Night on September 7th.

English II Pre-AP Policies and Expectations

Grading System for each six weeks average is calculated as follows:

- 1. Homework and Daily assignments are worth: 20%
- 2. Quizzes and mini-projects are worth: **25%**
- 3. Unit Tests are worth: 25%
- 4. Essays and major projects are worth: 30%

Failed tests /quizzes

Students may retake failed quizzes or tests (with the exception of reading checks) within one week of receiving the failing grade to improve that grade for a maximum of 70%.

Late work

<u>All</u> assignments (homework, mini-projects, major projects, essays, presentations, etc.): These are due <u>at the beginning of the period</u> on the due date.

Late assignments will receive a maximum of a **70%**. After three **consecutive** school days, the assignment will no longer be accepted.

Make-up work due to absences

Students are expected to keep up with missed work. Go to my website and click on the powerpoints and documents to download missed assignments. Students must check for make-up work the day they return from absence and are given 48 hours to complete an assignment that is due. Note: Extra-curricular activities are NOT given the same 48-hour window for make-up work – all work is expected to be completed and turned in on time with other classmates by the assigned due date. All missed/absent work due to an extra-curricular absence must be obtained PRIOR to the schedule extra-curricular absence and NOT when the student returns from the extra-curricular absence.

Extra credit

There will be an extra credit opportunity provided to the entire class every six weeks. Extra credit assignments cannot be created for individuals to "save" students at the end of the grading period.

Behavior

Class time is learning time. No student has the right to prevent any other student from learning. This includes cell phone use. Cell phones will be collected every day unless they are being used for an academic purpose.

No member has the right to harass or belittle another person in the classroom; sexual harassment, racist and homophobic language and hate speech will not be tolerated. Self-respect and respect for others are the basic guides for behavior.

Academic Integrity

All students involved in

- copying any assignment or working on an assignment with others without permission
- cheating by *qiving or receiving* help on any test or quiz
- or plagiarism (using others' work and claiming it as your own)

will receive a <u>zero that cannot be made up or replaced</u>. In addition, students' parents or guardians will be contacted and the student will receive a <u>disciplinary referral</u>.
