# 1. Person vs. Person

- ▶ External conflict between one character and another.
- ▶ Protagonist vs. Antagonist



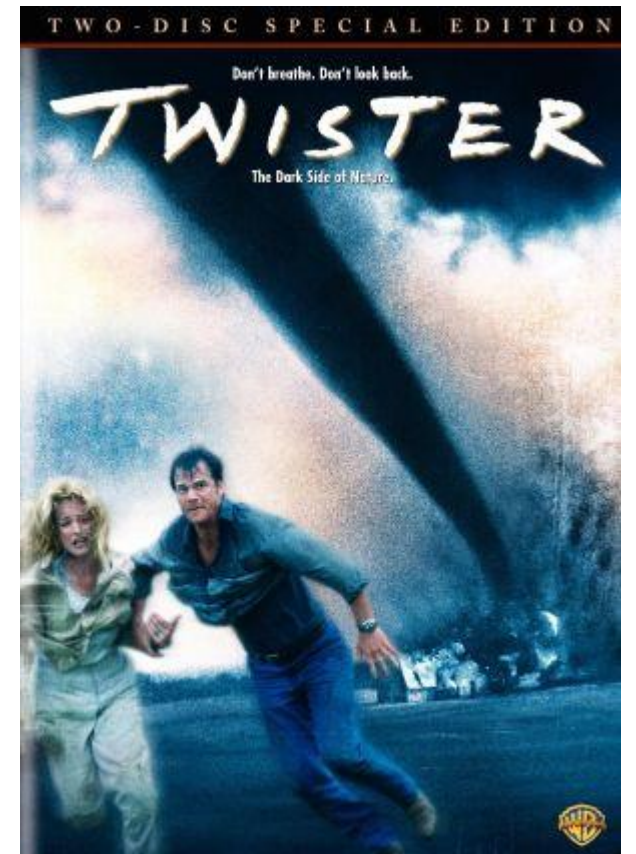
## 2. Person vs. Society

- ▶ External conflict when the protagonist has an issue with a large group or sect of people.



## 3. Person vs. Nature

- ▶ External conflict with a character working against nature.





## 4. Person vs. Self

- ▶ Internal conflict when the character is fighting against himself.



# 5. Person vs. Technology

- ▶ External conflict with character facing machine/robot/technology
