

SYLLABUS

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English I: Overview and Policies

Welcome! This will be one of the most challenging and stimulating classes you have ever taken. Besides working to improve your reading and writing skills and preparing for the EOC Test, you will need to display the skills required for life both in and out of high school – personal accountability, responsibility, organization, respect for others, and taking pride in your work.

All students in English I classes are expected to display initiative and responsibility when it comes to time management and completion of assignments. The pace is faster and more demanding than middle school. You must attend to deadlines without constant reminders. You can expect a wide variety of challenging reading material. Most of the selected works are considered Adult Literature and may be beyond the level of sophistication and maturity you may have encountered with the Young Adult literature of middle school. This class will focus on critical analysis and the intensive development of advanced composition techniques.

Major Units of Study:

Students will study various works of literature, vocabulary, grammar, writing, and EOC practice and preparation. This course will focus on the Language Arts Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) curriculum.

Materials and Textbooks:

Students will be issued literature textbooks and supplemental novels as necessary. Students will also select independent reading materials from the Bowie library, the Austin Public Library, or other sources.

Homework Policy

- Homework is to be completed and ready at the **beginning** of class.
- You will be supplied with a homework calendar and are expected it to fill it in every lesson.

Tests / quizzes:

- Students may retake <u>any **failed**</u> quizzes or tests (with few exceptions) within **one week** of receiving the unsatisfactory grade to improve that grade.
- You must make an **appointment** to retake quizzes or tests. Please take advantage of this fantastic opportunity to improve your grade!

Late Work

- All assignments (daily work, in-class assignments, homework, essays, projects, and presentations) are due at the **beginning** of the period on the due date.
- A late assignment will be accepted up to a **week** after the original due date for no more than **70**% credit.
- Any work submitted after one week from the due date will
 not receive credit.

Absences

- It's **your** responsibility to make up class work, notes, homework, quizzes, tests, etc. and see the teacher to guarantee this opportunity to make up missed work.
- Any work that was due the day of an absence should be submitted in your next lesson.
- Extenuating circumstances will be handled on a case-by-case basis, at the teachers' discretion

Passes to leave class

- Ask permission to use the pass.
- If granted permission, fill out information on Pass Log when you leave and come back.
- You will not be able to use the pass during the first 15 or last 15 minutes of class.

Tardiness

You are considered tardy if you are not in the classroom when the bell rings.

- If you are tardy, enter the class as if you are on time.
- Give the teacher your pass and go straight to your seat.
- If you do not have a pass, you will make up the missed time after class.

Plagiarism

Copying and cheating will not be tolerated. This serious offense will be dealt with through the policy listed on the following sheet.

Participation

- 1. One person speaks at a time.
- 2. If you want to speak, please **raise** your hand and wait to be acknowledged.
- 3. Actively listen to one another.
 - Make eye contact, even if that means turning your body.
 - Ask if you're unclear about a statement.

You commit plagiarism if:

- You fail to acknowledge the sources of any information in your assignment which is not either common knowledge or personal knowledge.
- You fail to acknowledge direct quotation either by using quotation marks (short passages) or indentation (longer passages).
- You too closely paraphrase the original words of your source.
- · You borrow the ideas, examples, or structure of your source without acknowledging it
- You take, buy, or receive a paper written by someone else and present it as our own.
- You use one paper for two different courses, or re-use a paper previously submitted for credit without the
 prior approval of both instructors.

You commit collusion if:

- You allow someone else to write and/or complete your assignment/essay.
- You write/complete an assignment with another student who has the same assignment, and both papers are
 identical in part, paraphrase one another or, are substantially similar in their ideas, examples, or structure.

The MINIMUM penalty in any case is a zero for the assignment and parental notification.
