


- Quotes around titles of newspaper articles \rightarrow "Sorry for Not Being a Stereotype"
- Underline titles of books → <u>Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian</u>
- Evidence \rightarrow You need to introduce the quote
 - Don't plop! "At three years old I was sorting."
 - Avoid introducing quotes with "it states/it says"
 - For novels → Give context and character
 - In the exposition, Junior explains, "At three years old I was sorting."
 - For articles → Give author
 - Pyrillis writes, "No wonder people are confused..."




