



The definition and usage of verbal irony is not important to remember; what *is* important to remember is that while these people are arguing back and forth about it, the rest of us are doing more interesting things like eating fried foods, stargazing, and riding jet-skis.

Dramatic irony is used in a narrative when an event occurs whose significance the audience understands but the characters do not.

For example, in Romeo and Juliet when the characters think that Juliet is dead but the audience knows she's only been knocked out by a sleeping potion.


