Motif/Symbol: Red



Red in *Purple Hibiscus*

The color red is both a motif (it is a concrete image that occurs repeatedly throughout the novel) and a symbol (it represents a complex set of abstract ideas and values).

Here are some instances:

- p.28: "red was the color of Pentecost"; Mama's wrapper and [Amadi's] robe
- p.16: Hibiscus "startling red"
- p.6: "red and green ribbons" in the missal
- p.33: Mama's blood; Kambili's vision in following pages (35, 37)
- p.89: Ifeoma "fearless" in a red wrapper; Amaka and Ifeoma's red lipstick
- p.100: Kambili's menstrual blood (foreshadowing of her being beaten?)
- p.99: Kambili spills the blood-red juice after Amaka criticizes Papa's cashew juice
- Papa's red pajamas

One part of interpreting a motif/symbol like this is to think about what else it is associated with.
