LITIGIOUS

- Def → Inclined to sue, aching for a lawsuit
- P.O.S. → ADJ.
- Clue → “Lettuce juice!”
- We picketed the store, yelling for more lettuce juice, and our litigious ways got it back in the store.

Egg Regis



EGREGIOUS

- Def → Noticeably bad, obvious
- P.O.S. → ADJ.
- Clue → Egg Regis
- The audience was getting so mad about all of his egregious mistakes; they wanted to egg Regis!

Character Analysis: Extended Metaphor

Goal: Create a representation on your GOOGLE SLIDE that showcases the multiple facets of your character through the book thus far.

➤ **Step 1: Brainstorm**

➤ Create a list of adjectives/descriptions of your character.

➤ **Step 2: Pick an object that correlates with these reasons.**

➤ Consider an object with multiple parts, changing ways, etc.

➤ **Step 3: Write at least three reasons why.**

➤ Put these on your slide!

➤ **Step 4: Find and write quotations under each reason as justification.**

➤ Use text evidence with a correct reference!

Example:

Okonkwo is a boulder.

Even if the whole village tries to move him, he won't budge.

“We should have killed the white man if you had listened to me”
(Achebe 195).



His relationship with his son is rocky.

“I will not have a son who cannot hold up his head in the gathering of the clan”
(Achebe 33).

His desire for a high reputation causes a hard exterior.

“He had had no patience with unsuccessful men” (Achebe 4).
