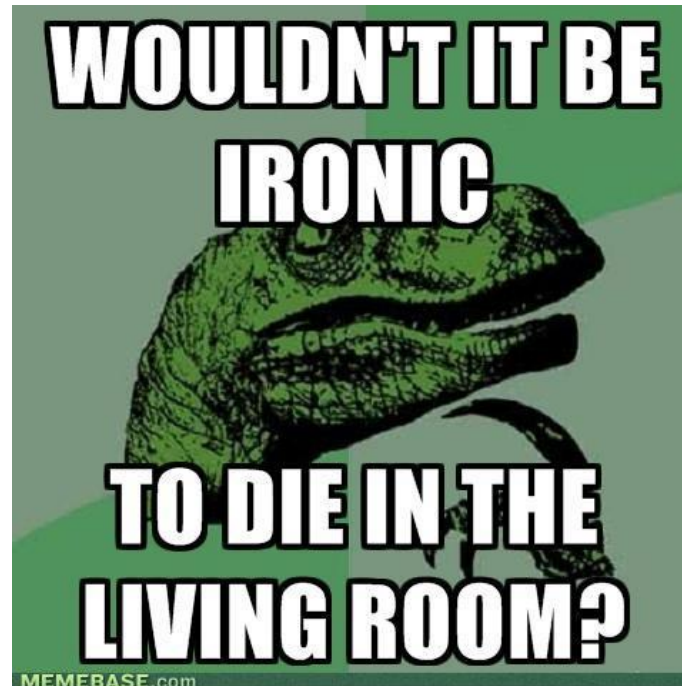

Verbal irony is when a speaker says one thing but means another.

SURE, I'D LOVE to go crawl inside that rotting goat carcass and find your missing wallet.



In this example, he's not particularly keen on crawling inside the dead goat.



Verbal Irony: When a speaker says one thing and means another.

Sarcasm: Verbal Irony with **judgmental/rude** intent.



****Sarcasm is always verbal irony, but verbal irony is not always sarcastic.****

- **Situational Irony**: An event occurs that goes against expectations that have been built up



- **Dramatic Irony**: When an audience perceives something that a character in the literature/performance does not know.

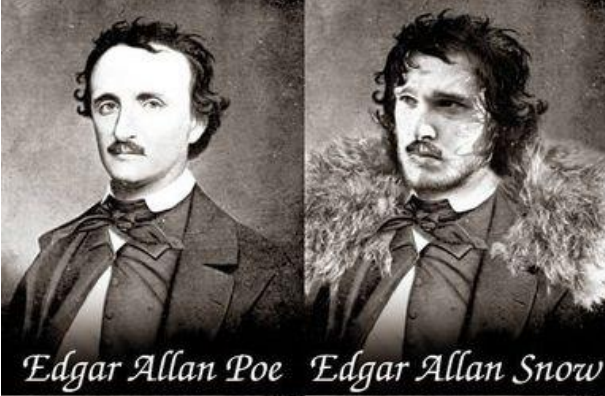
