

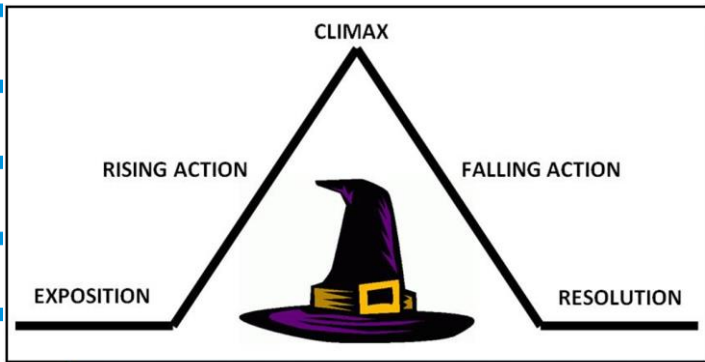

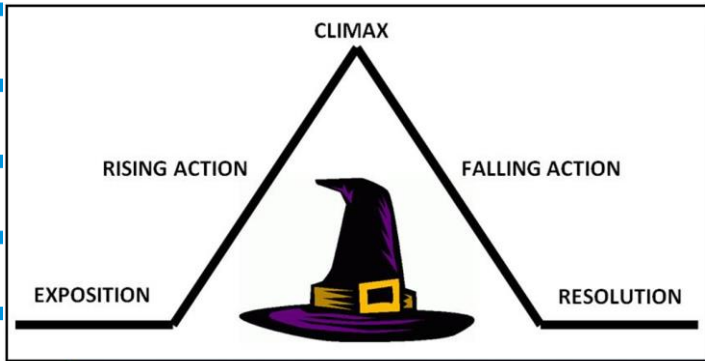
Little Miss Muffet
