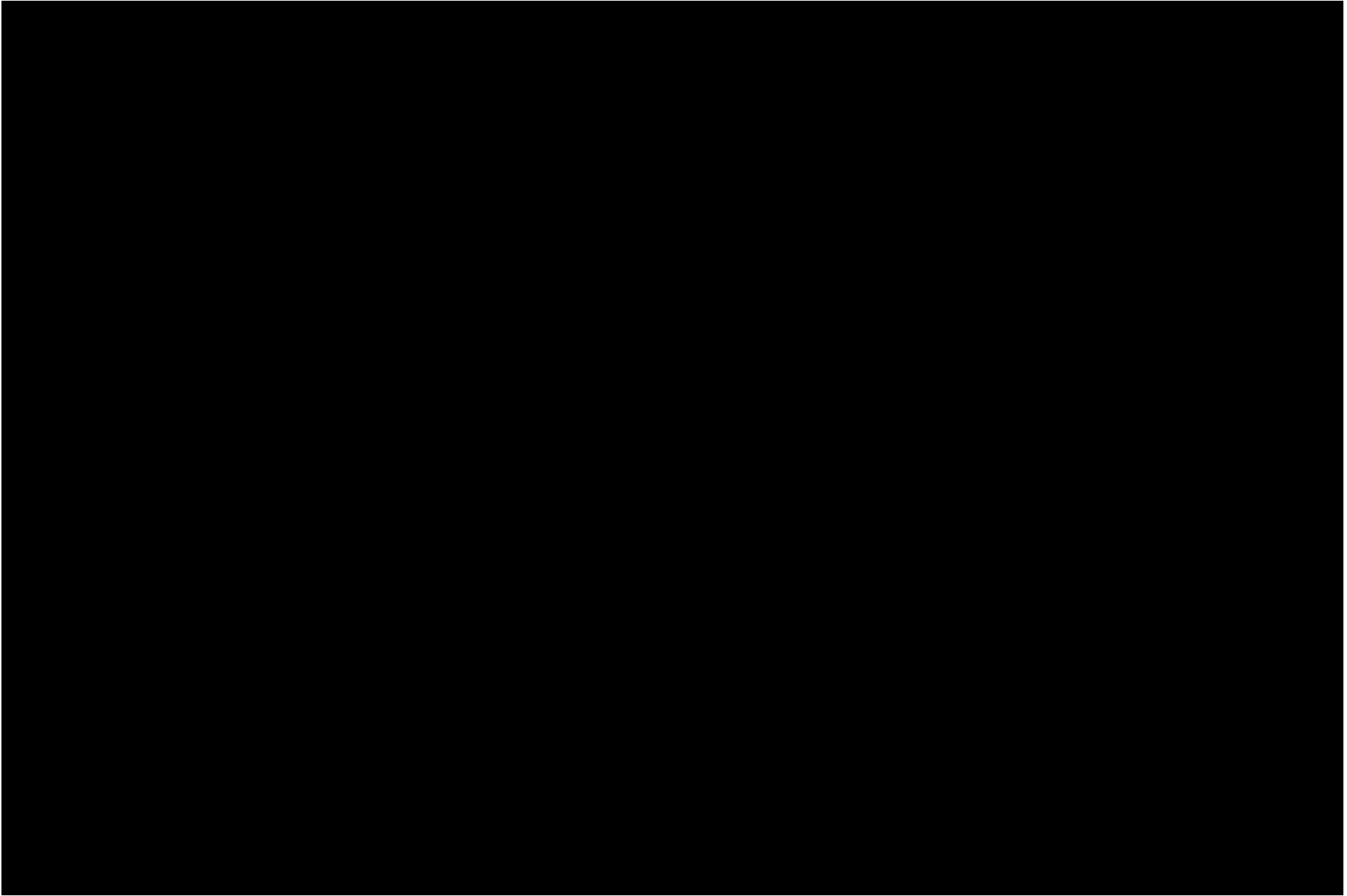

# NOUNS

- A person, place, thing or idea

- Example → The monkey ate the burrito.

- PROPER nouns → Names of SPECIFIC noun that needs capitalization

- Example → The monkey ate the burrito from Taco Bell.

# Pronouns

- Words that replace nouns
- It, he, she, we, you, us, etc.
- Example: He ate it.

# ADJECTIVES

- Words that describe nouns
  - Examples → The purple monkey ate the smelly burrito.




# VERBS

- Action words

- Example → The monkey ate the burrito.

- **LINKING VERBS:** is, am, are, was, were, be

- Example → The monkey ate the burrito. It was gross.

  
It = gross

# ADVERBS

- Words that describe VERBS, adjectives, and other adverbs
- Most of them end in -ly
  - Answers the question HOW did the action get done?
- Example: The monkey quickly ate the burrito.

# Conjunction

- Joins phrases or words together

- **For**
- **And**
- **Nor**
- **But**
- **Or**
- **Yet**
- **So**

- Example → The monkey ate the burrito, **and** then he did a dance.

# PREPOSITIONS

- links nouns, pronouns and phrases to other words in a sentence.

## **PREPOSITION SONG: (To the tune of Yankee Doodle)**

About, Above, Across, After,  
Against, Along, Among, As,  
Around, With, At, Before, Behind,  
Below, Beneath, Beside

Amid, Between, Beyond, But, By,  
Concerning, In, Down, During,  
Except, For, From, Inside, Into,  
Like, Near, Off, Of, On, Out

Outside, Over, Past, Since, Through,  
To, Toward, Under, Until  
Up, Upon, Within, Without  
And More With Compound Parts

- Example: The monkey ate the burrito in the shower.

# INTERJECTION

- Words that exclaim something, using a “!” mark.
- Example → Wow! The monkey ate the burrito.

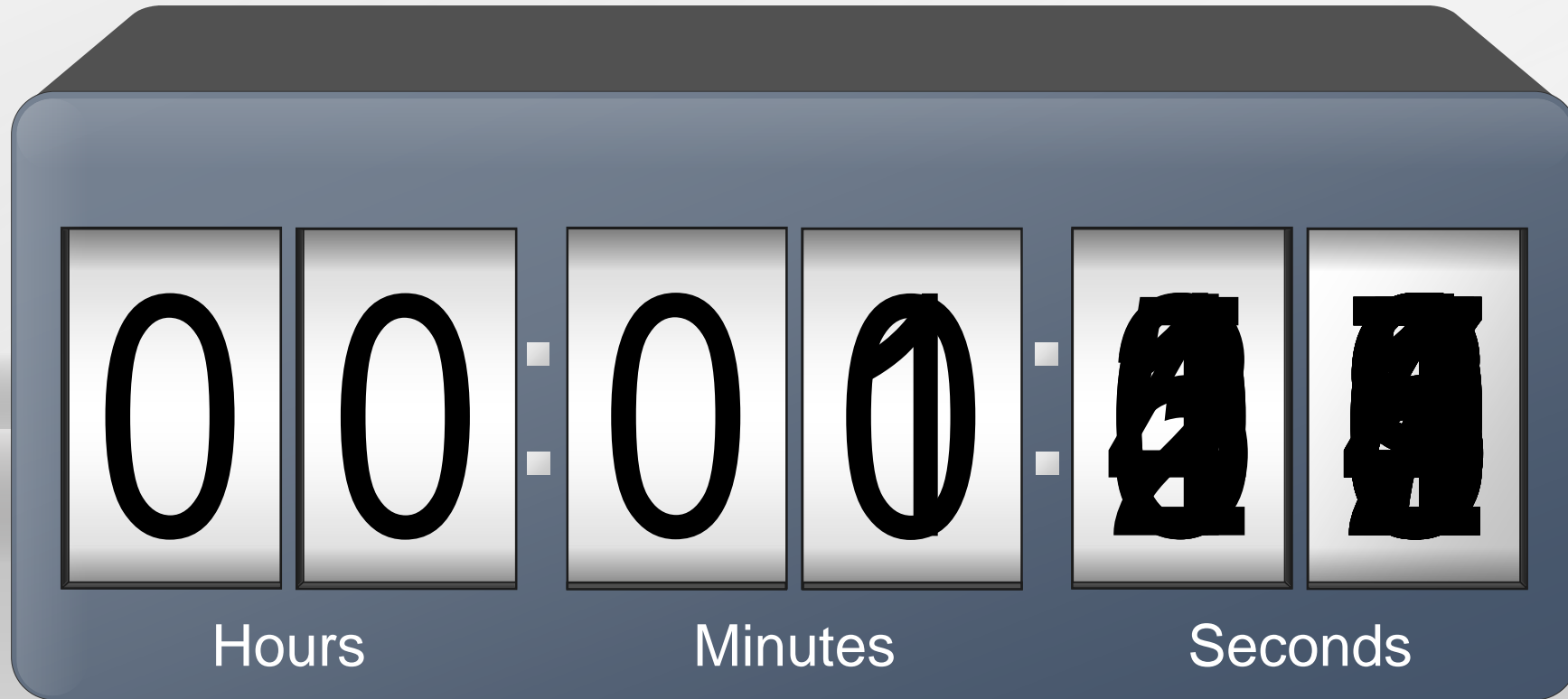
